K-6 Afterschool Program-Partnered with Summer School

We start picking kids up at 8:00 to get them to summer school by 8:30. K-6 Summer Program starts at 10:00 and ends at Noon. During that time we do at least 2 activities a day, then prepare and feed the kids lunch. At 12:00, we take the 3rd-6th grades to the Teen Center for Tween Time, where they are fed lunch and do activities. We then run the younger kids home or to daycare. Every Thursday we do water activities with the kids. We stay pretty busy averaging about 20 kids a day!








Recovery Report:

June was a hard month for outdoor events due to the rain. We had to reschedule our Movie in the park 3 times before we finally got to have it. We showed "Beautiful Boy" on June 24th and had 29 people in attendance. We had a Picnic in the Park on June 18th and had 26 people attend, even with the cool, rainy weather! On June 11th, we had a staff inservice where we got certified in Mental Health First Aid for Youth. We took 2 buses and the van to Silverwood on Saturday July 9th, and had 129 people with us! We have a campout coming up this weekend, on July 15,16,17th at Lolo Creek Campground up Glennwood. On August 6th we will float from Kooskia to Kamiah and then head to the park for a BBQ. On August 12,13,14th we will have another campout at Fraser park outside of Weippe, and on the 27th we will have a drive-in movie (movie TBD). We will be helping with an open house on August 25th. We are also planning our Overdose Awareness Day event on August 31st. The Recovery Subcommittee meets on July 19th at 7:00pm to plan the details.

Family Resource Report:

We celebrated the graduation of this round of SFP classes on July 6th with a pizza party and Silverwood! Once school starts, we will start another class. We have had a steady number of people needing food and clothing. We have also been busy helping with lots of recovery services. We just got a new shipment of naloxone in, so if you know anybody in need, send them our way. Alateen still happens every Wednesday at 3:45 pm at the Presbyterian Church. If you know someone who needs assistance with anything, please have them reach out to me.




